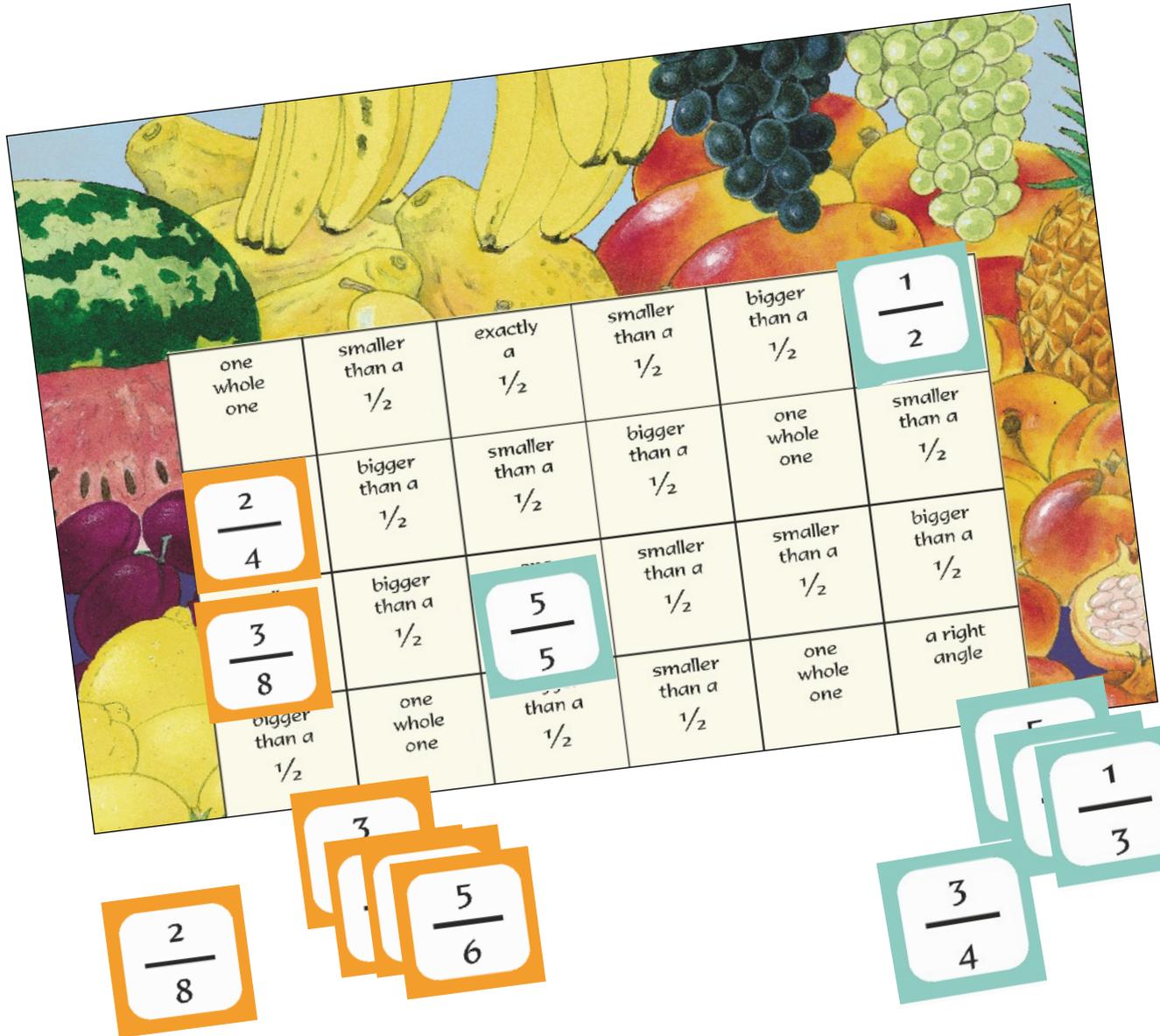


Bigger or smaller than Half Connect Four

Context:

Preparation:

Print out the A4 sheets.

If possible, laminate the "baseboards" and cover the pages of the cards with 'clear pvc self adhesive film'. Then cut out the squares to make the cards

HOW TO PLAY:

You need four people, one baseboard and two sets of cards (different colour borders).

Work with a partner to make a team of two.

Shuffle your team cards and place them in a pile face down.

Take turns to turn over your top card and decide where to put it on the board.

The team with the first four cards in a line either vertically, horizontally or diagonally wins.

Try to build the connections, but don't forget you can block the opponents too!

Learning Outcomes:

Students will be able to work out whether a fraction is more or less than a half.

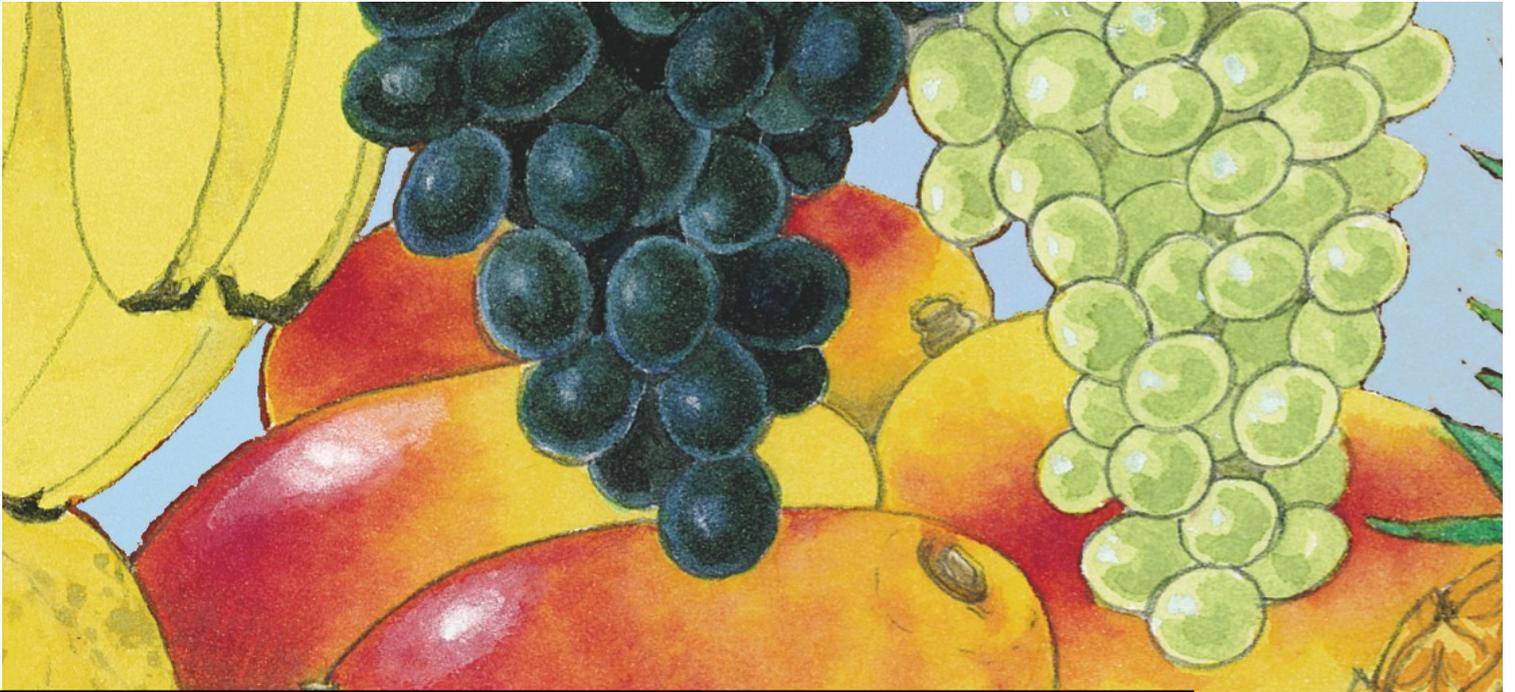
