This game is designed to consolidate children's knowledge of some well-known folk tales.

Suitable for pupils aged 5+

The Learning Outcome will be that pupils will be able to define and describe the selected folk tales and identify the key themes, characters and settings.

Theme: Folk Tales Age range: 5+

Context:

This game is designed to consolidate children's knowledge of some well-known folk tales.

The stories we used are: Goldilocks and the Three Bears; The Three Billy Goats Gruff; Buri and the Marrow; The Elves and the Shoemaker; The Little Red Hen and the Grains of Wheat.

Preparation:

Print out the A₄ sheets.

If possible, laminate the game board and cover the cards with 'clear pvc self adhesive book cover film' before cutting them out.

There are two versions of the board; Connect 3 (for those with less knowledge of the folk tales) and Connect 4.

HOW TO PLAY:

You need four people, one game board and two sets of cards (different colour borders). We have provided word cards and also cards with pictures.

Work with a partner to make a team of two.

Shuffle your team cards and place them in a pile facing down.

Take turns to turn over your top card and decide where to put it on the board. Everyone has to agree that the card matches the description on the board.

The team with the first four cards in a line (or three depending on the game board) either vertically, horizontally or diagonally wins.

Learning Outcomes:

Pupils will be able to define and describe the selected folk tales and identify the key themes, characters and settings.
